### YARD DEBRIS

# AUTOMOTIVE BATTERIES & USED MOTOR OIL

Used motor oil can be recycled at the curb if you have curbside garbage service, or at most auto parts stores. Automotive and marine batteries can be recycled for free at most auto parts stores. Call ahead for quantities and restrictions.

### **Curbside Used Motor Oil**

Put motor oil in 1-gallon milk jugs with screw-on lids. Label with your name and address. Put 2 feet from recycling cart. Limit 2 gallons per collection.

### **Stores Used Motor Oil**

Put used motor oil in securely closed I-gallon milk jugs and take them to a location equipped to collect and recycle motor oil.

# MEDICATION (6)



Return your unwanted and expired medication to keep your home and environment safer. In Redmond medicine drop off is located at Group Health Pharmacy 7765 159th Pl. NE, Suite #100, Mon-Fri 8am-6pm and Sat 9am-Ipm. NO controlled substances, NO sharps. Visit www.takebackyourmeds.com for a list of what is and is not accepted.

### **N**EEDLES & SHARPS

Sharps and needles can not be put in the garbage. Search online for "sharps mail in program" or ask your pharmacist.

### Syringe & Sharps Drop Box

Only home-generated sharps may be disposed of at Public Health Centers. Outdoor drop boxes are available 24 hrs a day. This service is available at no charge.

First: Put your used sharps and syringes in a manufactured sharps container or a 2-liter plastic pop bottle. Make sure the lid fits tightly, then tape it shut for added safety. If you use a plastic pop bottle, label it with the warning: "SHARPS, DO NOT RECYCLE."

Then: Bring your full container to the drop box site. You are responsible for putting your sharps in the drop box at the site. If your items will not fit in the drop box, please bring them inside to the Health Clinic's reception desk. If the clinic is closed, please return to the clinic and dispose of your sharps during normal business hours. Please call for details and restrictions.

### LATEX PAINT

Latex paint is not accepted at household hazardous waste facilities. It can now be put in the garbage as long as it is dried up or solidified. To solidify, mix paint with equal parts cat litter, sawdust, or paint hardener. After solidified, place in garbage with the lid off. You can also check with theatres in your city to see if they are able to use extra paint.

# OIL BASED PAINT, CHEMICALS, AND PESTICIDES

These items are all considered household hazardous waste. Household hazardous waste is accepted at the King County Hazardous Waste Mobile which visits Redmond three times per year. More info in the Household Hazardous Waste section

### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household hazardous waste is accepted at the King County Hazardous Waste Mobile which visits Redmond three times per year. It is also accepted at the Factoria Drop-Off Site located at 13800 S.E. 32nd St., Bellevue, open Tues - Fri, 8:00am - 4:00pm Sat and Sun, 9:00am - 5:00pm Call 206-296-4466 to confirm hours.

Accepted: oil-based paint, cleaners, pesticides, propane tanks, flourescent tubes/bulbs, motor oil, gasoline and antifreeze.

Not accepted: latex paint, empty containers, electronics, explosives, medicine, and garbage. Call 206-296-4692 for details.



# PLASTIC PLANT CONTAINERS (6)



Plastic plant containers that are black, rigid and round can be recycled at the city's Special Collection Events held three times a year. They must be unbroken without cracks and only 1, 2 and 5 gallon pots, rinsed clean, are accepted. See the Special Collection Event Section for more information.

All these items can be recycled in your curbside recycling toter. There is no limit on the amount of clean recycling you can set out for collection at no additional charge. Put recycling that doesn't fit in your cart in recycling bins, cardboard boxes (limit 2'x2'x2') or a 32 gallon can with handles marked "recycling". # SMALL APPLIANCES & SCRAP METAL

Small metal appliances and scrap metal are accepted in your curbside recycling toter with these safety limitations:

- No greasy or sharp metal (to protect collectors and sorters from injury)
- Limit 35 lbs, 2x2x2 ft.

Accepted small appliances include: toaster ovens, blenders (bottom part only), curling irons, hand mixers, food processors, metal coffee pots, irons, waffle irons.

Accepted scrap metal includes: engine parts, tire rims, bike parts, household metal hardware such as hinges, door locks, short pieced of metal pipe, worn out pots and pans, small barbeques.

If the item works, sell or donate it. Reusing an item saves 20 times more energy than recycling it!

### LARGE APPLIANCES



Household appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, stoves, hot water heaters, washers and dryers, can be reused or recycled. Some businesses also accept dishwashers and microwaves. Call ahead for fees and restrictions.
