Redmond works with regional partners and on its own to create, implement an evaluate its conservation programs.








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Redmond Adopted Its Goal, October 2007

"The City of Redmond and its existing residents and customers by the end of 2013 will strive to achieve a savings, compared to their current usage, of 170,000 gallons of water a day on an average annual basis and during the peak season will strive to achieve a savings of 245,000 gallons per day."

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Redmond's Goal (cont)







 Based primarily on the Cascade goal and program (Redmond will also continue local programs)



 By 2013, this savings represents a 1.6% reduction in demand from what would have occurred, not including growth
