

# Proposed neighborhood boundary changes

The Bear Creek CAC is considering two neighborhood boundary changes that it believes will result in better participation opportunities for residents and business community members alike.

The first change would add multi-family areas west of Avondale Road to the Bear Creek neighborhood. The CAC is considering this change because: Avondale Road is a major shared experience for people on both sides of the road; it allows the Avondale corridor to be addressed as part of one neighborhood plan update; there was little participation from the area west of Avondale Road during the Education Hill neighborhood plan update, and so this affords another participation opportunity; and it would result in a better population balance among neighborhoods. The City has included this area in outreach efforts since the start of the neighborhood plan update.

The second change would move most Business Park- and Industry-zoned land along Union Hill Road into the Southeast Redmond neighborhood. Among the reasons the CAC is considering this change are that: similar industrial land



uses exist on both sides of Union Hill Road; there is interest from the business community in making this change so that business community members can focus on one neighborhood plan update instead of two; and it allows the Union Hill corridor to be addressed as part of one neighborhood plan update.
