



Dear Prospective Riding Club Member:

Thank you for your interest in the Farrel-McWhirter Riding Club Program. Enclosed is information about the program, required medical release form, and the application form. Enrollment is ongoing, and this information packet will provide you with everything you need to get started.

Along with the hands-on equine experiences, Volunteers are encouraged to participate in monthly meetings, Riding Club field trips, special instructor lead activities, and have the opportunity to earn riding lessons. Volunteers are required to attend initial and ongoing training sessions, held monthly.

A Riding Club Volunteer must be responsible and reliable, and interested in gaining knowledge and experience with the equine and various farm animals at Farrel-McWhirter Park. A love of horses is also a must! Volunteers are responsible for helping with all levels of equine care. From picking pastures and cleaning water troughs, to grooming and tacking up for classes, Volunteers get many opportunities for hands-on horse time.

Interaction with the public is also a key element to this position. This is a valuable way to gain skills in customer service, and Riding Club Volunteer conduct must reflect the City of Redmond's high standards at all times. Volunteers are always under the supervision and guidance of a Riding Instructor or staff member. Volunteers are also always paired or grouped, and volunteering is an excellent way to gain experience working as part of a team.

Every hour worked at Farrel-McWhirter Park as a Riding Club Volunteer goes towards earning lessons with the highly qualified Riding Instructors. These lessons range in experience levels, and are tailored to fit beginner walk/trot to more advanced walk/trot/canter groups. Volunteers also have the opportunity to qualify for special bonus activities like the "Watershed Trail Ride" and "Golden Horse Shoe" event.

Mission Statement:

To provide a safe and fun environment for Riding Club Volunteers to learn the skills necessary to enable them to meet their equestrian goals, while helping each participant to develop the qualities of responsibility, leadership and self-confidence through positive, equestrian themed activities.

Activity Details:

Riding Club Volunteer Assistant Program: Riding Club Members assist with the equestrian educational programs for both children and adults, and are a vital part of the Farrel-McWhirter Riding School. They are always under the supervision and direction of a trained staff person. Volunteers will be paired or grouped, and will never be alone in the park or pony yard while helping with general farm maintenance and programs.

During class time, Volunteers will be helping with class prep and clean up, as well as assisting with actual equestrian classes. This will include grooming and tacking up the ponies, handling ponies, directing participants and the cleaning of equipment and pony yard.

Riding Club Meetings & Activities: Meetings are the second Thursday of the month at the Old Redmond Schoolhouse Community Center (16600 NE 80th Street, Redmond) from 6:30 to 8pm. **Attendance is important!** Meetings are designed to provide members with information on all things equine, upcoming events, and training opportunities. Riding Instructor staff and special guests will present monthly educational materials.

Riding Club Training Program: Eligibility for training rides requires a minimum of volunteer hours worked in a month. Sign ups for training rides and shifts are set up online. Earned training ride times are determined by the availability and health of the ponies, skill level of the member, and the amount of volunteer hours accomplished. Lessons are offered at the walk/trot and walk/trot/canter levels. Members are responsible to sign up for appropriate lesson levels.

Training sessions and earned lessons will be based on the Volunteer's skill and ability levels. All Members begin at the novice level, regardless of prior experience. This is so they can better understand how programs run, learn the important safety rules, become familiar with the various ponies, and have their skills evaluated by the Riding Instructors. All new Volunteers are required to "shadow" a more experienced Member.
